BRITISH PAIR GO 2005

Say It With Flowers



The 15th Pair Go Championships were held on 10th July at the now regular venue of the Foxcombe Lodge Hotel at Boars Hill near Oxford. The date was later than the usual May to keep a distance from the European Pair Go in Maidenhead in April. Again the hotel made the players very welcome and put on a huge buffet at lunch time. Moreover the weather was unusually hot and sunny, and too hot to play serious Go outside.

In the Championship group, previous champions Kirsty Healey and Matthew Macfadyen were unable to win the Pair Go Championship for a fifth year. They were drawn against the second favourites, Natasha Regan and Matthew Cocke, in the first round. In a close game, Natasha and Matthew won by 1.5 points only. Also doing well was the husband and wife team of Alison and Simon Bexfield, who were back after a year's absence for the birth of their second daughter. They won their first two games to reach the final against Natasha and Matthew. After a long fight it was Natasha Regan and Matthew Cocke, from London and York, who were the new British Pair Go Champions. Third were Sue Paterson and Granville Wright from Sussex, and Kirsty Healey and Matthew Macfadyen from Warwickshire, both on two wins. Simon Goss and Emma Marchant were the ones this year that got the fighting spirit prize.

The handicap group neatly had 8 pairs too. From the oldest to the youngest player there was an age range of some 70 years. It was the father and teenage daughter from Kent, Paul and Maria Tabor who were the champions with 3/3. They beat Jil Segerman of Brighton and Anthony Pitchford of Cheshire in the final. The handicap section's fighting spirit prize went to young Sasha King (30 kyu) who was playing with Christian Scarff, also from Swindon.

The best dressed pairs were judged to be Kirsty and Matthew, as Matthew kept his jacket and bow-tie on all day, and Jackie Chai and her husband John Johnstone. By pairing off the most numbers with similar properties, Paul and Maria Tabor won the number quiz with 7/14 correct.

All the prizes purchased by organiser Francis Roads were pairs of pot plants, including a pair of bonsai trees, shrubs and various flower plants, both indoor and out.

European Pair Go Championships 2005

Alison and Simon Bexfield were the UK's official representatives in the European Pair Go Championships at the Hitachi Europe headquarters in Maidenhead on 23rd and 24th April 2005. Most other strong UK Pairs took part. Natasha Regan and Matthew Cocke were fifth on tie-break from Kirsty Healey and Matthew Macfadyen in sixth. Anna Griffiths and Tony Atkins were the main organisers. Winners were Germany's Lisa Ente and Benjamin Teuber. Germany were also second, Russia third and Czechia fourth. A game from each round was broadcast live on IGS-PandaNet (http://www.pandanet.co.jp/English/). There was also the first Triangle Tournament. A separate report covers these championships.
