Other Pair Go News

British Champions Kirsty Healey and Matthew Macfadyen represented the UK in the Pair Go at the first **World Mind Sports Championships**. These were held in Beijing in October 2008. The event counted as the 19th International Amateur Pair Go Championships. Matthew and Kirsty won their first game against the pair from Argentina, and beat Finland in the second. They were in the toughest of the four groups, with Korea, North Korea and Russia, and as the groups were all-play-all, they would have to work hard to get through to the knockout. They beat Italy but lost to both Koreas and also to Russia. They finally beat Belarus to end the group fourth with 4/7.

20 pairs from 12 countries took part in the **European Pair Go Championships** held in Prague. Winners on 6/6 were Russians Natalia Kovaleva and Dmitrij Surin. This was the fourth win in row for Natalia and the third for Dmitrij. Second on 5/6, were Jitka Bartova and Jan Hora from Czechia. Again, unfortunately, no UK pair was able to take part.

At the **London Open**, at the New Year, day 2 evening was the Pair Go with 10 pairs. The winners were Guo Juan and Ian Davis. Scoring 3/4 were Martha McGill and Matt Crosby, and Annika Piiroinen and Antti Holappa.
