THE 12TH WORLD AMATEUR GO CHAMPIONSHIP:

This competition brought together the representatives of about 40 countries.

HELSINKI: (EGP)

The winner was Shutai Zhang (6 dan, China) with 6/6 from Viktor Bogdanov (6 dan, Soviet Union) with 4/6. Third was Ronald Schlemper (6 dan, Netherlands). Matthew Macfadyen was Seventh. There were 35 competitors, including 13 of dan grade.

VARSAW: (EGP)

The winner was Shutai Zhang again with 6/6, and second was Manfred Wimmer (6 dan, Austria) with 5/6. Viktor Bogdanov was third. There were 69 players, but only a few were from Western Europe.

LEICESTER:

The 13th Leicester Tournament produced a record 90 entrants

The winner was Des Cann (3 dan, Coventry) with 3/3.

Other prize winners were: Alan Thornton (1D Hemel Hempstead), Phil Achard (2k C, London), Mark Simmons (4k Bradford), Philip Leupin (5k N, London), Stephen Bailey (7k W, Surrey), David Mitchell (13k Coventry), James Goss (24k Stowe)

Qualifiers for the 1991 Candidates' Tournament were: Alan Thornton and Phil Achard.

The small board competition winner was: Joseph Beaton (12k Furze Platt),

and the runner-up was Jodie Hamlet (22k Brakenhale).

There was a four-way tie for the team prize between: Bradford, Coventry 1, Coventry 2, and North London, all with 66%.

EUROPEAN GO CONGRESS IN VIENNA: (EGP)

24 Britons attended the Congress which saw about 250 competitors from 23 countries.

Whilst there were no British prizewinners, it seems that Vienna was a fine city to visit.

The main event was won by Rob van Zeijst (6 dan, Netherlands) with 9/10.

Second was Shutai Zhang and third was Hans Pietsch.

Matthew Macfadyen was the top Briton at 18th with 6/10.

The weekend tournament was won by Ruslan Saifullin (Soviet Union) with 5/5.

Second was Egbert Rittner (Germany) and third was Manfred Wimmer (Austria).

The Ing Cup which was competed for by the top eight Europeans was won by Rob van Zeijst.

The Lightning competition was won by Robert Rehn (Netherlands).

FUJITSU EUROPEAN GRAND PRIX:

The European Congress marked the culmination of the 14 rounds of this year's competition:
