



BRITISH GO CHAMPIONSHIP This year Matthew Macfadyen, British Champion 2010, won all seven games in the Challengers' League to earn the right to defend his title. Hui Wang and Alistair Wall just missed out on playing for the title by one win each. Nick Krempel (3 dan London), won five games in the League, and is now playing Matthew in a best-of-3 final. The first round was played on Sunday 3rd July at Matthew's house in Barford, Warwickshire; Matthew won by resignation. Round 2 was played on Sunday 17th July at Nick Wedd's house near Oxford; Nick Krempel won by a narrow 2.5 points after an epic 6hr30 (plus lunchtime) battle. Round 3, winner-takes-all, will take place in London on a date to be determined. MILTON KEYNES, 2 July 2011 Andrew Simons, 3 dan from Cambridge, increased the territory of his titles by adding Milton Keynes to Oxford, Maidenhead and the Small Board. The only other player out of the 26 at this year's MK to win all three was local player Richard Scholefield, 9 kyu. The team prize was rather inhospitably won by the 'Concrete Cows' team with 7/9, and Alex Selby won the MK Go competition with a modest, though perfect, 2/2.

WELSH OPEN, BARMOUTH, 25 June 2011 - 26 June 2011 For the first time ever the Welsh Open was tied. Winners with 4 out of 5 were Durham 2 dans Alex Kent and Sandy Taylor, continuing Durham's dominance of recent tournaments. David Phillips (1 dan) from the Isle of Man also finished on 4, but had a lower SoS, so was thrid. Others winning prizes were: for 4 wins Edward Blockley (5 kyu Worcester) and Peter Timmins (9 kyu Shrewsbury) and for 3 wins and a Jigo, Roger Daniel (5 kyu London). 30 players took part and enjoyed the foul weather on Saturday and the usual brilliant Barmouth standard on Sunday. In between 20 people (players and partners) enjoyed a meal at the Min-y-Mor Hotel (the venue) on Saturday night



SHODAN CHALLENGE 2011-12 The Shodan Challenge This year's Shodan Challenge is now underway, with around 20 challengers hoping to achieve their goals over the next year. 

## BRITS INTERNATIONAL:

WORLD YOUTH GO CHAMPIONSHIP, BUCHAREST, ROMANIA In the World Youth Go Championships, 12 - 18 August, Vanessa Wong came 7th out of 12 with 2 wins out of 5. She defeated players from Singapore (4 dan) and USA (6 dan), losing to Poland (5 dan), Korea (4 dan) and China (2 dan professional). With the first 4 places being taken by China, Korea, Taiwan, Japan; this was a very creditable result. China also won the under-12.

EUROPEAN GO CONGRESS, BORDEAUX. Russian 7 dan Ilya Shikshin retained the European Championship by beating Catalin Taranu in the final. This year the top 8 placed Europeans played knockout after round 7 which gave rise to an exciting final on the last day. Winning the play-off for third was Ukraine's Artem Kachanovskyi, who beat Alexandr Dinerchtein. Top British player was Vanessa Wong who won seven games to place 22nd, including beating Israeli 6 dan Ali Jabarin in the last round. Michael Webster (1 kyu) and Patrick Ridley (10 kyu) both won 6 games out of 10. Korea's Young-Sam Kim was the Open champion. 757 players took part.


