TOURNAMENT RESULTS

Oxford Go Tournament

Sunday 16th February

106 players attended Freud's Cafe, enjoyed a buffet lunch and go by candle light as it became dark. Winner was a visitor, Walthar Warnaar (4 dan), from the Netherlands. Oddly four 2 dans won all three games: Simon Goss (Bracknell), David Ward (CLGC), Yang-Sheng Wang (Reading) and Paul Smith (Cambridge). Also on 3/3 were Dave King (3 kyu Swindon), Jonathan Reece (3 kyu Oxford), Steve Smith (17 kyu Hursley) and Graham Horsley (25 kyu West Surrey). Young Kim won the 13 x 13.

Cambridge Trigantius Go Tournament

Sunday 2nd March

74 players took part in the Trigantius this year. Also there were the 8 women competing in the British Women's and about a dozen beginners in their own event. One of the local Cambridge teams won the team prize, but it was Norwich's Matthew Cocke (5 dan) who won beating Jean Michel (5 dan F) in the last round. On 3/3 were David Ward (2 dan CLGC), Matthew Holton (1 dan Teesside), Howard Manning (3 kyu Cambridge), Richard Mullens (5 kyu Stevenage), David Smith (12 kyu Teesside), Paul Hyman (15 kyu B'Hale) and Graham Horlsey (22 kyu West Surrey). Highest placed kyu players were 1 kyus Nick Wedd and Simon Bexfield. Nick Wedd also won the 13x13.

Women's Qualification Go Tournament

Sunday 2nd March

Alison Jones finished first ahead of Helen Harvey, Alison Cross, Kirsty Healey, Sue Paterson, Elinor Brooks, Lena Morrish and Anna Griffiths. Points are scored towards trips to the Women's World Amateur; currently in the lead is Kirsty Healey. Sue Paterson was our 1996 representative.

International Teams Tournament

Saturday 8th March

This was a 'by invitation' event in which a team of Japanese players resident in Britain competed against a few clubs which could field suitably strong teams. The Cambridge team won with Wanstead and Reading as runners up. Only Mr. Nishida from the Japanese team won 4/4.

Korean vs British Teams

16thMarch

This event, which was held in the Toby Jug at Tolworth in Surrey, pitched together teams of 12 players. After three rounds the score was 18 all, and so a rapid play-off was held to decide the winner. This resulted in a 3-0 win for Britain.
