Rules

This will be a six-round McMahon tournament, with Fischer timing of 30 minutes main time, plus 10 seconds per move bonus. Same start times of rounds, etc., as last previous. Single-day players are also most welcome. Any players wishing to miss certain rounds are welcome to do so. Komi is 7 points. Otherwise, BGA rules apply. Prizes will be awarded to those on 4.5 wins or above (extra prizes at organisers' discretion).

Entry Fee

£20: Standard entry fee for BGA members or members of a national Go association.

£26: Non-BGA member's entry fee.

£13: BGA member concession's entry fee – as follows:

Concessionary rates apply to UK residents who are:

- under 18 on 31st August 2021, or
- under 26 and studying full-time at an approved educational establishment in the UK, or
- receiving an unemployment, disability or Pension Credit benefit

All the above are halved for people playing on only one of the days.

A bit about Go Magic (stylised as) & their web site https://gomagic.org/ ... Go Magic is "A Modern Platform for Learning Go - Everything you need to up your game".

They supply online lessons, courses, quizzes and more - some free - to help Go players learn or improve at Go. Do please take a glance at their web site!

I've been impressed by several pages that show their concepts and a couple of other pages that caught my eye include:

- https://gomagic.org/about/ shows the team behind the project, and their ethos.
- https://gomagic.org/premium/ shows costs of membership, starting at \$22 for 3 months.

Wow, this keeps getting better, for players at the Barmouth tournament this w/e. We've now heard, from the BGA secretary, that at Barmouth all contestants will receive a 2nd free prize. It's a deal the BGA have negotiated with the sponsor - https://ai-sensei.com/ I'd recommend that any Go-player tries out Al Sensei, even in advance of this w/e, as it's a way to have Al tools show you how good your moves in a game are, and it's FREE to use their basic facilities, to show you how their system works. Full facilities need a paid membership, and players at Barmouth will get a code, giving them 7 days' full membership - a free trial of all the facilities, if you like. And so, of course it makes sense not to redeem you free 7 days, until you've sampled the basic concepts for free anyway. The company is founded by the German champion Benjamin Teuber (6-dan), and given a recommendation too from Artem Kachanovskyi, EGF Professional 2-dan, both of whom I've been privileged to meet.
