










The British Go Association Junior Go Badges

The following badges are available for juniors as they progress through the go grades. Junior Go club organisers may award badges as their members show progress. Those players without a club may apply directly for the relevant badge.

	<p>For those learning to play go. Available to any club member once they have attended 3 sessions of their club meetings.</p>			
	<p>Must be able to play and score a whole game on 9x9 or 13x13 boards.</p>			
	<p>Must understand the concepts of two eyes equals life, false eyes, seki and ko.</p>			
	<p>Able to play on 19x19 board and understand some basic opening strategy.</p>			
	<p>Will have expanded on 25 kyu knowledge to include some basic joskei and basic endgame moves. Will understand importance of sente versus gote. Ready to play in adult tournaments with entry grade of 20 kyu.</p>

How to obtain a badge

Youth Go organisers will be able to apply to hold a supply of badges ready to award to their members.

We recommend that players pay £1 for their badge, although this can be waived if this would cause hardship.

When players have progressed up to the next level they may swap their badge for the next one for no charge. Alternatively they can buy the next one up and retain the old one as well.

Junior players not attached to a junior club may apply direct for a badge by contacting the badge scheme administrator. Postage will cost an additional £1.
