### European Go Congress, Copenhagen

Returning from his year as an insei student in Tokyo, it was hardly surprising to see Ronald Schlemper, 6-dan (NL) win the European Championship. Second was his compatriot Robert Rehm, 5-dan. Matthew Hacfadyen had a play-off match with Andre Moussa, 5-dan (F) for third place which he lost.

As well as the 16 players competing for the Championship there were another 150 in the Main Tournament (10-round Macmahon), of whom 21 were British. Their results were as follows, with entry strengths in brackets:

As you can see, none of our players disgraced themselves, and the general standard was average-to-good. The one exception was Eddie Shaw, who entering at 1-dan scored 9/10 to come second overall (and would have been overall winner had not your editor failed at the last hurdle to take a game off Gerald Westhoff, 2-dan (NL), the eventual winner).

Jeffrey Ansell also won a prize on tie-break in his division, and honourable mention to Nick Webber for 4/5 in the Week-end Tournament. More details in BGJ of course; for the time being just a slightly wistful comment on the fact that although there were 18 players present with Kyu grades in double figures, no British player below 4-Kyu thought it worth attending. What a mistake!
