The Oxford Go Tournament on February 18th attracted an entry of 70. Choi (5-dan) of Birmingham won, and for some reason a second prize was awarded to Matthew Macfadyen. W. Brakes and M. Harvey secured the Dan and Kyu players places respectively in the Candidates Tournament. Other prizewinners, with kyu grades in brackets, were: S. Hinsley (4), A. Thompson (8), D. Killen (10), M. Stevenson (11), C. Wright (12), L. Rutland (16), and P. Collins (17).

Cambridge University Go Society's attempt to veil details of the Trigantius Tournament (March 17th) in a cloak of secrecy was rather unsuccessful, as 55 players turned up. Terry Stacey (5-dan) was overall winner: M. Cumper and R. Borcherds gained the Dan and Kyu players Candidates Tournament places respectively: and other prizewinners were I. Marsh (3-kyu, Bracknell), S. Hood (6-kyu) and H. Roberts (16-kyu), both from Cambridge, and G. Cory (18-kyu) and L. Rutland (12kyu) from Maidenhead.

Perceptive readers will have noticed an interesting change in entry strength for one Lee Rutland in the two tournaments. Lee, who is 13, and from Furze Platt Comprehensive School, is currently rated at 10-kyu. In the event of our being offered a place in the projected World Youth Go Championship in Taiwan, he will be our representative. The latest match results from the Furze Platt School Go Club (which has been in operation less than a year) is: played 13, won 8, drawn 3, lost 2. Any challengers?

Leeds Grammar School were once again the hosts for the British Go Association Schools Championship on April 1st, under the direction of Clive Fraser. The competition was fought on an even-game teams-of-four basis. What turned out to be the final was between the home team, which took second place, and the eventual winners (yes, you've guessed it) Furze Platt Comprehensive School.

A new series of coloured diplomas relating to various strengths between 3- and 25-kyu will be available soon. It is hoped that they will be a source of encouragement to our younger players.
