TOURNAMENT RESULTS

Devon Go Tournament

Saturday 13th July

24 players attended the second Devon, this year held at the Moorlands Hotel in Haytor Vale on the edge of Dartmoor. The winner was Thorstein Thorsteinsson who beat fellow Bristol 3 dan Antonio Moreno in the last round. Richard Helyer (12 kyu Oxford) won 3/3. Best on 2/3 were Terry Wright (4 kyu Bristol) and Sarah Jackson (11 kyu Hursley). A special prize went to young Jimmy Mao (22 kyu Bristol) who was playing in his first tournament.

Epsom Downs Wedding Tournament

Saturday 10th August

At the double small board event to celebrate the marriage of Paul Margetts and Yvonne Mao the winner from the 18 go players was Alistair Wall (4 dan Wanstead) with 5/5. Best of the 15 guests was Nick K from Derby scored 4/4.

22nd Northern Go Tournament

Weekend 2-3th September

This year there were 57 players at the Northern Tournament in Manchester. The top three players all ended with scores of 5/6 so the places were based on a tie break. First equal were Matthew Cocke and T. Mark Hall, and third was Matthew Macfadyen. Other winners were: Peter Yim (1 kyu Manchester), Ed Blockley (2 kyu Malvern), John Walsh (4 kyu Manchester), Richard Thompson (6 kyu Leicester), Mike Vidler (6 kyu Manchester), Adam Atkinson (9 kyu Brighton), Tom Summerscales (9 kyu Culcheth), Jason Fisher (12 kyu Manchester), and Adrian Abrahams (15 kyu). A special prize was given to Catherine Schille (25 kyu Chester) who beat all within 11 grades of her.

Milton Keynes Go Tournament

Saturday 14th September

56 players gathered for this year's tounament which was won by T. Mark Hall (4 dan Bristol). Prize winners with 3/3 were: Tony Atkins (2 dan Reading), Alex Selby (2 dan Cambridge), Geoff Kaniuk (2 kyu CLGC), Jo Beaton (5 kyu Furze Platt), and George Haig (10 kyu Swindon). Bank of China Cup:

Sunday 22nd September

The new Bank of China Cup tournament attracted 88 entrants, including many strong players. Unusually for a one day tournament, the bar (above which all players start with even games) was set at 5 dan. The winner was Shutai Zhang (7 dan). Other players who ended the day on scores of 3/3 were: Harold Lee (4 dan CLGC), Alex Selby (2 dan Cambridge), Vic Morrish (1 kyu CLGC), Martin Smith (1 kyu Middlesex), Jackie Chai (3 kyu Bournemouth), George Haig (10 kyu Swindon), Dennis Rowntree (13 kyu), Andrea Smith (15 kyu Cambridge), and Nicola Hurden (22 kyu Brakenhale). Cambridge won the team proze. Vic Morrish and Martin Smith qualified for the 1997 Candidates' Tournament.

British Championship:

The first two games in the best of five series between Champion Shutai Zhang and Challenger Matthew Macfadyen have now been played. Matthew won the first game and Shutai won the second. The next two games are planned to be held as extra events at the Swindon and West Surrey tournaments
