7th Women's Amateur Go Championship in Japan, 8th - 9th November

Somehow I mixed up the report on this, in the last newsletter, with the Pair Go [-ES]. So here is the correct account:

Helen Harvey (1k) was Britain's rep and came 12th with 3/6. Winner of the Sotetsu Cup was Japan's Chifumi Yamashita, second North Korea, third South Korea, fourth China and fifth Singapore.

Brakenhale School Party, Wednesday 9th December

28 kids battled on 13x13 boards, solved problems, ate and enjoyed this year's raffle. Tournament winners were Claire May (now 30k), Theo Elliott (now 24k) and Lucie Elliott (now 28k). Quiz winners were Elizabeth Wayte and her 8 year old sister Laura.

Fujitsu Finals, 12th - 13th December

The Fujitsu Cup in Amsterdam was won by Guo Juan who beat Catalin Taranu (3p) in the final. Losing semi-finalists were Gerlach (5d) and Pietsch (2p).

25th London Open Go Congress (EGP) sponsored by Hitachi, 31st December to 3rd January

This was again sponsored by HITACHI and attended by 150 players at the usual venue the Highbury Round House community centre. This year two lady professionals were present: Liu Yajie from China and Nam Chihyoung from Korea. The top group of players was quite strong this year. After six rounds the European GP points were awarded to Lee Hyuk (15), Guo Juan (12), F. von Arnim (10), V. Chow (8), J. Finke and M. Cocke (5.5), E. Nijhuis (4), S. Zhang (3), M. Macfadyen (2), and J. Rickard (1). Lee, Guo, Zhang and von Arnim made the cut. Guo beat her earlier vanquisher Lee in an exciting final so top five places went to: 1 Guo, 2 Lee, 3 Felix von Arnim, 4 Emil Nijhuis, 5 Vincent Chow. Players on 7/8 were Theo Elliott (24k UK) and P-E. Martin (3k S). On 6/8: Shawn Hearn (23k UK), Walter Wandel (4k NL), G. Kreutz (4k D), D. Mechtenberg (3k D), David Woodnutt (1d UK). All players on 5/8 got a certificate. The Lightning Tournament was won by South Africa's Vincent Chow (5d), second was last winner Emil Nijhuis (5d NL). Continuous 9x9 winners were Kai Gogl, Jonathan Chetwynd, Tim Hunt and Shawn Hearn (Under 13).

Furze Platt Go Tournament, Sponsored by Hitachi, Saturday 16th January

Candidates' Tournament, Weekend 13th - 14th March

The 1999 Candidates' Tournament, which is a qualifying competition for the British Championship, will be held in the Daiwa Foundation, 14 Cornwall Terrace, London NW1 on 13 and 14 March. There are four rounds with time limits of 90 minutes. Entry is by invitation to dan players and selected kyu players. All players entitled to play should receive an invitation by post from the Championships Organiser, Charles Matthews. Queries and entries to him at 01223-350096 (am best), charles@sabaki.demon.co.uk, 60 Glisson Road Cambridge CB1 2HF. The draw will be run by members of CLGC. There will be a fee of £5 to cover table hire and coffee. No side event this year.

Under new rules, posted in full in the BGA web site and available on request from Charles, four players will be entitled to go forward from the Candidates' to the Challengers; then five will be selected from the British Open at Abingdon (6 rounds with 60 minute time limits); then one player will be chosen on Stacey points; and any reserves then needed will be taken from the Candidates'. The system is intended to produce the strongest possible Challenger's of 24 players. To that end also the BGA would like to include in its invitation list for the Candidates' any players of suitable strength, who are not British nationals but are members and satisfy a five year residence condition. Since the BGA has no way to keep residence records, Charles would be very grateful to have drawn to his attention any neglected qualifying player.
