RESULTS

Barcelona Go Tournament, 19th - 20th February

The winner was Miyakawa Wataru (6 dan F) on 5/5. Two UK players won 3/5: Natasha Regan (6 kyu) and Matthew Selby (7 kyu).

Cambridge 24th Trigantius Go Tournament, Saturday 4th March

73 players took part in the 24th Trigantius, this year held in St Paul's Church. Thanks to Alistair Wall beating Seong-June Kim the tournament was a fourway tie: Cambridge's S-J. Kim (6 dan) and David Ward (3 dan), and Wanstead's Francis Roads and Alistair Wall (both 4 dan) shared the cash prize donated by Hitachi. Sharing the Best Kyu cash prize were: Mike Nash and Geoff Kaniuk (London) and Wenbo Mao (Bristol), all 1 kyu. On 3/3 were: David Ward, Paul Russell (6 kyu), Roger Murby (8 kyu), Jonathan Medlock (13 kyu) all from Cambridge, Martin Cook (19 kyu York) and Simon Jones (19 kyu Berks Youth). On 2.5/3 were William Brooks (9 kyu Cambridge) and David Firth (10 kyu Cambridge) and on 2/2 was Hoi Ping Mok (14 kyu Cambridge). 13x13 winner with 10/10 was Shawn Hearn (12 kyu Berks Youth).

Inq European Youth Championships, 4th - 5th March

125 children attended in Sinaia, Romania. Winner U18 was Diana Koszegi (H 5dan) and U12 was Ilia Chikchine (Rus 2kyu).

Oxford vs Cambridge Varsity Match, Saturday 11th March

The annual Varsity match was held in Cambridge this year, on Saturday 11th March. Previous years have seen 4 person teams, but this time Oxford turned up with 9 players plus 3 beginners who tagged along to see the city and maybe catch a few games. Cambridge mustered 8 players. The final score was 10-7 to Oxford, thus maintaining the tradition of visiting side winning now in its 3rd year.

Coventry Go Tournament, Sunday 26th March

72 players took part in the tournament and the winner was Seong Jun Kim (6 dan Cambridge) with 3/3. Second place went to Toby Manning (3 dan Leamington). Prize winners with 3/3 were: Paul Clarke (1 dan High Wycombe), Mike Cockburn (2 kyu St Albans), Richard Helyer (5 kyu Oxford), Richard Thompson (6 kyu Leicester), L. Chane-Chuen-Kee (6 kyu Cambridge), Gustav Rober (11 kyu St Albans), Stephen Streater (18 kyu Epsom Downs). Paula Mannegio won a special prize for a near miss. The team prize went to St Albans (Alan Thornton, Chris Dawson, Mike Cockburn and Gustav Rober). The 13x13 was won comfortably by Nicola Hurden and Paul Blockley received the Youth prize.

Dublin Open, 31st March - 3rd April

The 11th Irish Open was attended by 33 players. Winner was Richard Hunter (4 dan Tokyo). Second on tie-break was Des Cann (4 dan Leamington). Third was David Ward (3 dan Cambridge). Winners on 5/5 were Alan Held (3 kyu Switzerland) and Roger Murby (7 kyu Cambridge), and on 4/5 Natasha Regan (5 kyu Epsom) and Gerry Mills (1 dan SE Wales). Rapid Tournament winner was Konagai (7p) with 5/5. Second was David Ward (4/5 including beating Saijo 8p) and third was Michael Marz (2 dan Germany). Handicap Champion was Des Cann.
